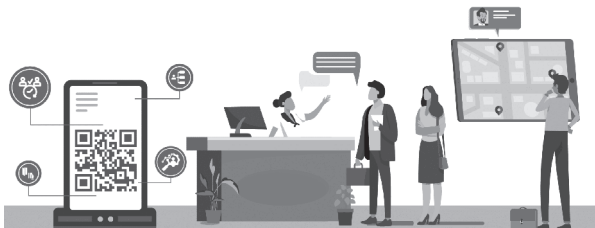
The policy applies to both **internal** and **external visitors** entering the premises, with internal visitors referring to employees of the organization visiting locations other than their base.

CURRICULUM DESIGN (CD 2020)

'Student led; Inquiry-based' learning is at the core of holistic development at DPSG schools: The Curriculum Design at DPSG, both innovative and comprehensive, provides for three major domains with opportunities for every learner to actively participate in each of the three with choices of subjects and activities.

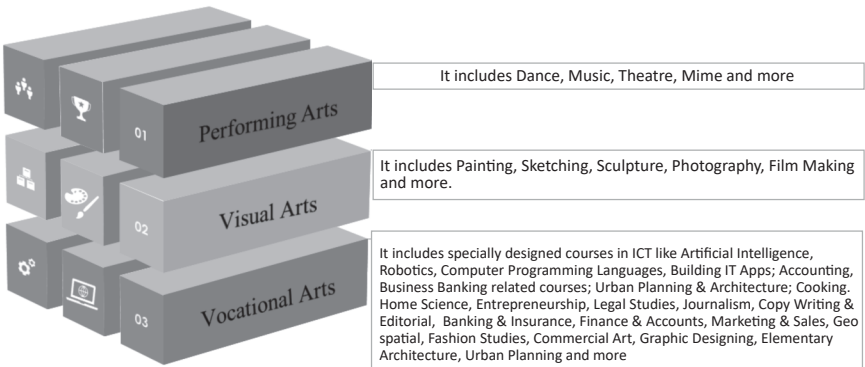


SCHOLASTIC DOMAIN

- The syllabus is arranged into Units of Inquiry [UI] and each UI has its own array of engagements. The Grade is not treated as a batch. Instead, each learner participates actively in the inquiry and benefits therefrom.
- Extensive documentation and digital tracking ensure that everyone gets attention and help comes forth from the educators or peers to address learning gaps, if any.
- Shift from pure information recall to building understanding of concepts together with scholastic skills and competencies – Learning to Learn & Learnability.
- Personalised Learning Pathways [PLP] where learners draw their individual pathways ensuring learner's success.

FOUNDATIONAL DOMAINS

Education today is far more and far beyond than just the academic achievement. It is about evolving physically, mentally, emotionally, socially and culturally with well-developed personal and social skills coupled with linguistic, numerical, logical & analytical competencies.



CITIZENSHIP STUDIES

Sensitizing learners to their society and environment – making them good and responsible individuals & citizens and reconnect them with their extended families.

HOUSE SYSTEM

The House System, which has a special relevance in our school, is a structured unit within which learners develop feelings of loyalty, responsibility and leadership. From class I onwards, the school is divided into Houses which compete in a wide variety of disciplines such as dance, music, debating, quizzing, dramatics, amongst others. Besides striving for academic excellence, DPSG aims to impart holistic education to the learners through various co-scholastic activities in different subjects by celebrating subject weeks. Throughout the academic year, the learners get the opportunity to participate in various inter-house, inter-class and inter-section competitions that encourage them to learn about teamwork, cooperation and various other life skills.

STUDENT YEARBOOK

Student Yearbook is a wonderful way to inculcate a sense of pride and self-realization amongst the learners. It captures memories frozen in time, events that happened and faces that change inevitably. It is essentially a memoir for the learners wherein they keep all their accomplishments, photographs, anecdotes, reflections in the form of an album. The Yearbook will provide an insight to the learners about how their thought process has evolved with time. Creating a Yearbook with the learners, helps the teachers to understand their learners better and make a connect with each learner of the class. The Student Yearbook comprises of the following components:

- How I Look
- My Likes
- My Year in School
- Highlights of Foundational domain during the year
- An album of my family and friends' photographs
- Memories of Class trip and Events
- What Mentors say about me
- My Participation, Achievements and Accolades
- Blessings by elders

The Student Yearbook is a ready reckoner for our learners. Looking back at the years gone by is a pleasant experience for them and helps to promote healthy relationships between the school and its alumni. Learners are expected to complete the SYB with utmost diligence and caution ensuring that the pictures used are of good quality and becoming of a memoir.

STUDENT STUDY PLAN

To give a wholesome learning experience to our learners, DPSG has come up with one-of-a-kind Student Study Plan, a comprehensive document that lays down the educational journey that a learner envisages for the forthcoming year. The innovative and path-breaking SSP includes mapping of core and elective subjects for an individual student both for Scholastic and Foundational Domain.

- Learners will select their Subjects, Sports, and Arts stream at the beginning of every academic year and would normally not be allowed to change their choices during the academic year.
- In consultation with the wing HM, the Home Room Teacher recommends the choice of subjects to the Principal, who shall finally approve the SSP for every learner.
- In case of classes XI & XII, however, the final subject choices shall require the Principal's approval.

Personalised Learning Pathway

At the end of each Unit of Inquiry, there is an End-UI Test, post which Teacher conducts an Assessment Dialogue with the learners, describing analysis of the End UI test-what went well, what could be better and how. This dialogue enables learners to identify their learning gaps and create a personalised learning plan. The learners revisit related concept, practice questions until the learning gap is closed.

GLOBAL CURRICULUM - GLOBAL OPPORTUNITIES

CBSE

DPSG schools are affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education. DPSG Schools pride themselves in producing **6 CBSE Country toppers over the years.**



INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME (IB PYP)

IB PYP programme, designed for learners aged 3-12 years, sensitizes the young learners towards global issues by incorporating them in the curriculum built around six transdisciplinary themes. The curriculum is engaging, relevant, challenging, and significant for learners. Among all DPSG schools, DPSG Meerut Road, DPSG Vasundhara, DPSG International and DPSG Palam Vihar offer IB PYP.



INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME (IBDP)

The IB Diploma Programme is a rigorous pre-university course of study designed for learners in the 16 to 19 age range. It is a broad-based two-year course that not only aims to encourage learners to be knowledgeable and inquirer, but also caring and compassionate. Only DPSG Meerut Road offers the IBDP course across all DPSG schools.

- Apart from the training given by the school, students are expected to devote some time studying and practicing concepts regularly at home.

- The safety and security of our students is the prime concern and responsibility of the school, and the school will take all steps to ensure the same. However, there are certain unforeseen incidents which are beyond the reasonable control of the school when students take part in any indoor and outdoor activities including sports, riding, trekking, excursions, camping, cycling, etc. or any other activity that is usually conducted by the school as a part of learning and if some untoward incident occurs, the onus will not rest with the school alone.
- The school or any teacher, or any staff member will not be held responsible for any loss or damage or injury of whatsoever nature caused to the student inside/ outside the school due to his/her own act or expression, negligence or any internal dispute between the students, intentionally or unintentionally creating any circumstances which could lead to causing hurt/injury/damage by any object or human being.

- The school authorities, staff, teachers will be free from all liabilities, claims, suits, demands, judgements, costs, interest and expense arising from such situations, including any accident or injury to the student and the costs of medical expenses.
- Parents must register a permanent address, mobile phone number/ landline number with the school on which SMS and other alerts may be sent. In case of change, the parents MUST notify the school within 3 days.
- Parents must ensure that their child adheres to the school uniform strictly. Children accompanying their parents during PTC days must also come in school uniform.
- Wearing of fancy shoes, jewellery, unruly hair and fancy haircuts, streaking/ highlighting of hair colours is not permitted.
- Usage of school bus is compulsory for all students unless, parents take on the responsibility to drop & pick their child.
- Pick up point for private commuters is outside the school. No stranger, driver or family friend is allowed to pick the children up.
- Once the child has come to the school, parents and guardians are not permitted to take him/her back home during the school hours unless there is a major emergency. In such cases, the permission of the Principal/HM is mandatory.
- Lunch boxes and water bottles are not allowed to be sent for students once they have entered the school premises.
- Parents and guardians are hereby notified that no school teacher at our institution is permitted to offer private tuitions. Adherence to this policy is mandatory. The Principal's helpline may be used to inform about any irregularity in this regard.
- Parents and guardians to be cordial and polite with the staff of the school even in the most taxing situations. Parents are requested to adhere to a proper dress code while entering the school premises.

SCHOOL DISCIPLINE

The school is committed to providing a safe, secure, and positive learning environment to all the students. Discipline policy is meant to act as an enabler in creating a positive and non-disruptive learning environment. Parents, too, must co-operate with the school in observing the following norms and disciplining the students:

1. It is compulsory for all students to attend the assembly and celebration of National Days.
2. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence from school/class without valid reason, habitual late coming, leaving the school premises without permission, disobedience and any type of unruly and objectionable behaviour are considered to be grave acts of indiscipline on the part of a student which can lead to his/her expulsion from the school.
3. The school uniform, only in prescribed school colour, should be immaculate, clean and smart, and should be worn on all working days and functions. Action will be taken against students who are habitually improperly dressed.
4. Students on their way to and from the school are expected to conduct themselves in a responsible manner. Being on the road in any mode of transport entails caution, care and attention to safety rules.
5. Students who expect to reach home late after the school due to personal reasons must inform their parents/ guardians in advance.
6. Students are expected to take proper care of the school's property. It is for their convenience. They should not break any item of furniture or fixtures in the school. They should not write, scratch or engrave graffiti on desks, chairs and other surfaces.
7. Students should not damage or remove things belonging to other students.
8. Any damage to school property or harm to any person or self-caused even by accident must be reported at once to the HM/ Coordinator/ HRT.
9. If a student causing damage to the school property is identified, he/she will be charged with a fine. In the event of collective damage to school property in a classroom, the entire class occupying that classroom will have to bear the cost of damages.
10. Students are not allowed to bring costly articles (like expensive watches, fountain pens, cameras, jewellery, electronic gadgets) and sharp and injury causing articles such as knives, scissors, paper cutters, etc., to the school.

11. Parents are requested not to give more than Rs. 100/- to their child. If for some reason, he/she is to bring more, written information must be sent to the HRT. In case the money is lost, it will be the sole responsibility of the student.
12. Running and shouting in the school premises is not allowed. While using staircases and corridors, all must keep to the left. Loitering in the corridors and office areas is strictly forbidden even during recess.
13. Students are strictly forbidden from purchasing eatables from unauthorized vendors/hawkers near the school premises.
14. Parents are requested not to send money to school against any verbal instructions. Money collection will only be done through a written circular duly signed by the Principal.
15. Bus monitors and lady guards are responsible for orderly behaviour in the bus. They ensure that only those students who avail the bus facility travel in the bus. Any unruly and indisciplined behaviour while travelling in the bus will result in withdrawal of the bus facility.
16. All our students are expected to observe the highest standards in their conduct. Use of foul, unparliamentary language is a punishable offence.
17. In order to acquire competency in spoken English, all students must converse in English while they are in school.
18. Using unfair means in a test or examination is a grave offence. A student who is found using unfair means will be awarded a zero in the subject and will be issued a strict warning. Repetition of the same offence will result in his/her expulsion from the school.
19. Students are not permitted to carry mobile phones to the school. If a student brings a mobile phone to the school, it will be confiscated for a period of six months. They are not allowed to use school phones without permission. They cannot be called to the school offices to attend to phone calls during school hours. However, in case of emergency, the HM/Coordinator may be contacted to make a call.
20. Students are not allowed to drive motorized vehicles such as cars, scooters and motorcycles in or outside the school unless he/she has a driving license.
21. Acts of indiscipline like linking names, spreading rumours, bullying others, making obscene gestures, cyber bullying, using intoxicants/smoking /vape are punishable offences. A student found indulging in any of these could be given severe punishment, as severe as suspension from the school.

22. Bunking classes or school is strictly prohibited. If a child is found bunking a class, he/she will be suspended from the school.
23. Writing on shirt/ uniform/ furniture is a punishable offence.
24. Resorting to physical violence, using holi colours, bursting crackers etc. will lead to severe penalty in the form of disciplinary action / suspension from school.

Non - compliance to instructional processes and requirements and non - adherence to school guidelines are punishable offences and will be dealt with as per the school policy.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

1. **Half Day Leave or Early Exit is not permitted.** In case of an emergency, a written application needs to be sent to the HM of the wing beforehand. Only parents will be allowed to take their ward back.
2. The parents of students who are bus users and wish to take their children home privately need to report to school at least half an hour before the school gets over and submit an application to the HM. After their child's attendance is marked in the bus register during the routing time, and the buses have departed their child will be handed over to them.
3. Children are expected to attend school regularly. Under affiliation by-laws of the Central Board of Secondary Education, all students are expected to log-in a minimum attendance of 75% of the total working days in the academic session. As such, no leave of absence is granted unless parents/guardians submit an application well in advance on plausible grounds for absence.
4. In case of sickness for any period of time, a Medical Certificate must be attached with the leave application.
5. If an unauthorized absence exceeds a period of 15 days, it shall be presumed that the parents are not willing to continue their child's education at DPSG and one month notice required for TC shall start from the 16th day of such unauthorised absence and charges shall be levied accordingly. If the parents want the child to resume classes, it shall be done only with the permission of the school management.
6. If the unauthorised absence exceeds a period of 15 days, the name of the absent student is struck off the rolls of the school. A penalty of Rs.5000/- shall be charged in case the rejoining is granted.
7. Students suffering from infectious diseases such as coronavirus, chicken pox, cholera, measles, mumps, whooping cough, swine flu and jaundice must observe the prescribed period of quarantine, and on returning to school, should produce a fitness certificate permitting him/her to do so.

NORMS RELATING TO WITHDRAWAL OF A STUDENT FROM THE SCHOOL

Withdrawal of a student from the school is necessitated under certain circumstances either in the student's family or in the school itself. The norms followed in this respect are given below. Parents must read these norms carefully and comply with them.

1. If a student needs to be withdrawn from the school, the parents/guardians of that student need to follow the procedure as mentioned under the Fee Refund Policy.
2. A student can also be asked, by the school, to be withdrawn on academic or disciplinary grounds including submission of false information to the school at the time of admission. Disciplinary action may even involve expulsion. The Principal's decision in such matters is final.
3. Misbehaviour on the part of parents/guardians with any member of the school staff may also lead to withdrawal of the student from the school.
4. Transfer Certificate (TC) on withdrawal is issued only after all the school dues are cleared by the parents/guardians.
5. Please note that any request seeking Transfer Certificate of your ward is required to be submitted through SMS system at **www.sms.dpsgs.org** only, one month prior to the beginning of the next quarter. Failure to do so will result in the next quarter's fee being applicable. Manual applications for admission withdrawal will not be considered.

RULES GOVERNING FEE COLLECTION

School fee is payable on a quarterly basis i.e. 3 months fee at a time (through SMS portal only) as per the details given below.

Date of payment will be considered as the actual date of realization of the payment in School's Bank Account.

Section B: New Admissions (Excluding Class XI)

Students who are new admissions will pay as per the Published Fee Structure of the school for the Academic year 2026/27 i.e. all Quarterly Tuition Fees and all other Fee components will be due, irrespective of their date of enrolment with the school.

Once they have been granted admission, and they become existing students of the school, the **"Fee Rules as per Section-A"** will become applicable to them.

Section C: Existing Students Class XI

Existing students can Re- Register themselves till upto 7 days, after the declaration of Class X Board Results. The Re-Registration Fee will be collected on-line, by creating an event on SMS/ERP.

In case existing Class X students going to Class XI do not re-register themselves within 7 days of the date of declaration of Class X Board exams, they will be treated as **"New Admissions"** i.e. they will be allotted new admission number and all the fee components applicable to new admissions will be levied on them.

The Full Year Tuition Fees will be applicable irrespective of their date of Re-Registration or date of enrolment as a new admission. Once they have been granted admission, and become existing students of the school, the **"Fee Rules as per Section-A"** become applicable to them.

MODE OF PAYMENT:

Parents should make the payment via Credit Card/Debit Card/UPI OR Net Banking before the last date to avoid late fine and penalty.

FEE PAYMENT PROCESS:

Visit the School SMS Portal - www.sms.dpsgs.org and follow the steps mentioned below:

ONLINE MODE

- Click on SMS LOGIN.
- Enter the Username and password of Parent SMS Portal.

- Click on ONLINE FEE PAYMENT.
- Select the Quarter & Click on PAY NOW.
- Check the Student Fee Details & Click on PROCEED.

It will show the following options for payment:-

- ✓ Debit/Credit Card-You will be directed to pay fees via Debit / Credit Card.
- ✓ Net Banking- You will be directed to choose from multiple Banks for Payment.
- ✓ UPI Payment-You will be directed to pay via UPI.

After the Payment, Online Receipt will get generated with the payment details on the SMS Portal.

FEE REFUND POLICY

For seeking withdrawal of admission, a student needs to give one month's notice prior to beginning of next Quarter i.e. for seeking withdrawal of admission request for withdrawal must be submitted on or before 28th Feb 2026 for 1st Quarter, 31st May 2026 for 2nd Quarter, 31st August 2026 for 3rd Quarter and 30th Nov 2026 for 4th Quarter. In case of discontinuation in the session 2027-28, an application must be submitted and approved on or before 28-02-2027. All fees must be paid in full before the issuance of Transfer Certificate (TC).

Refund of **Quarterly Fees** will only be permitted in below mentioned circumstances and on submission of Documentary evidence supporting reason for Withdrawal.

- **Transfer of Parent to different District/City/State** - Parents must submit proof of transfer viz. their transfer letter/appointment letter for new location and proof of admission of student in new school. For getting the TC, a student needs to give one month's notice in lieu of which the student needs to pay one month's fee as per the fee rules of the society. For e.g. a student applying for TC in April will have to pay Fee for April and May and will be refunded for the month of June. Fees will be charged according to the policy, if not paid.
- **Health Reason**- Doctor's certificate for justifying the withdrawal of student from school to be further certified by the resident/nominated doctor. For getting the TC, a student needs to give one month's prior notice in lieu of which the student needs to pay one month's fee as per the fee rules of the society. For e.g. a student applying for TC in April will have to pay Fee for April and May and will be refunded for the month of June. Fees will be charged according to the policy, if not paid.
- **Unfortunate Demise of Student**- Fee will be refunded for the month in which student has not attended even a single day in the month. Notice period clause will not apply for this case.
- **Expulsion of Student on Disciplinary Ground**- Fee will be refunded for the month in which student has not attended even a single day in the month. Notice period clause will not apply for this case.
- **Any Other Reason**, if it justifies the withdrawal of students in mid-quarter, it should be approved by the Chairman if recommended by the Principal.

RULES FOR USING SCHOOL LIBRARY ON SMS

- There is a Library module on SMS, which can be accessed through the student's SMS Login.
- You can raise a request for reserving the book on Library module, prior to the scheduled Library session in the grade timetable.
- The reserved book will be issued on first-come first-serve basis.
- Carrying an ID card to the Library is mandatory as book will be issued digitally.
- A book will be issued for a period of 15 days only.
- Once the book is issued, there will be an information on your SMS dashboard, with a mention of the date of return.
- If you don't return the book timely and the due date is over then a fine of Rs 5/ per day will be charged.
- If the book issued to a student is not returned for two months, then it will be considered as lost.
- In case the book is lost then, either a new book of the same title can be submitted in the Library as a replacement or twice the printed cost of the book, will be charged as fine.
- The due fine amount will be visible on the SMS dashboard of the Student, just like it will appear on the dashboard of the Librarian.
- The fine amount will be automatically debited from the quarterly fees of the student.
- You can submit the Book Reviews through Library module on SMS and participate in the race to become an AVID READER and earn a badge of recognition.
- The school website also has a dedicated page for e-library named **E-Granthalaya**. It has a huge collection of free online resources, which anyone can explore and use, like National Digital Library of India (NDLI), Diksha Portal, National Science Digital Library (NSDL), UNESCO Digital Library, Story Weaver, Open Access Journals and many more.

TRANSPORT RULES

1. Application for availing transport/change in transport routes/withdrawal of transport shall be made online by the parent through parent dashboard on SMS portal only.
2. Transport details, including routes and availability, can be viewed through the school's SMS Parent Portal. Parents can track the live location of the school bus and raise requests for starting or discontinuing transport services directly through the platform.
3. The school makes transport arrangements for the children through its own fleet of buses on an annual contract explicitly on request from parents.
4. Unauthorised travelling in the buses is viewed as a serious offence .
5. Parents are expected to co-operate with the school by ensuring that their children travelling in the buses report at their embarking points well on time, carry their identity card with them all the time and behave in a disciplined way, in the interest of their own safety as well as that of the other users.
6. In case of any problem or any mishap, the parents are advised to avoid any altercation with drivers and conductors. They should immediately contact the school authorities on the phone number given on the bus or the phone number given in the almanac. The school will ensure appropriate action in such circumstances. For any information whatsoever, parents are expected not to rely on any information that they may get from drivers and conductors. For information related to their wards and academic process, timing or working days, they should contact the school directly.
7. Parents are requested to study the specified routes and opt for those which suit them best. Please remember that it is not possible to cater to individual requirements at the cost of time and distance.
8. Students are not allowed to travel in any other bus route except their own route. However, they can do so with the permission from the respective bus incharge.
9. The bus drivers are authorised to stop the bus only at the designated stops. The bus will not wait for late comers.
10. Full month fee will be taken for availing transport in the middle of the month. Acceptance of request for change in transport is based on route and availability of seats.
11. Any change in transport will be effective from the next month of submission of request.
12. **Withdrawal of Transport Facility by Parents:** In case of 'Withdrawal of bus

facility', the request intimating the withdrawal of facility should be submitted and approved one month before the beginning of "Next Quarter", with one exception that Class X and Class XII students cannot request the withdrawal of facility for Quarter IV.

Example:

Students seeking withdrawal for :

1st Quarter must submit an application and the same should be approved on or before 28.02.2026

2nd Quarter it should be submitted and approved on or before 31.05.2026

3rd Quarter it should be submitted and approved on or before 31.08.2026

4th Quarter, it should be submitted and approved on or before 30.11.2026

The above must be strictly adhered to; failing which, the full fee for the next quarter will be charged.

SCHOOL ERP AND WEBSITE

School Management System (SMS), which is the school ERP, is a web-based system that enables parents to access their ward's information and continual progress in real time. Parents can access students' and school related activities on the web by using a secured login provided to them on www.sms.dpsgs.org.

SMS empowers the students, teachers, and school to achieve more with different assessment tools, reports, and online information. While saving time, SMS lends transparency, makes systems efficient, leading to overall improvement in the institution. All the students and staff of the school have been provided with Microsoft IDs and are on MS Teams.

The school's official website www.dpsgs.org/international keeps students and parents updated and informed about the latest developments taking place in the school. The website is regularly updated with latest circulars, notices, academic as well as co-curricular achievements of our students besides details of day-to-day events (assemblies and activities) conducted in the school. The website also contains links to access the school's blog page.

The website is solely operated and administered by a dedicated department of the DPSG Society and is committed to provide easy access, navigation, and availability of data on the website. The school also has an **official Facebook & Instagram** handle which is regularly uploaded with latest events, activities, results and other related information.
