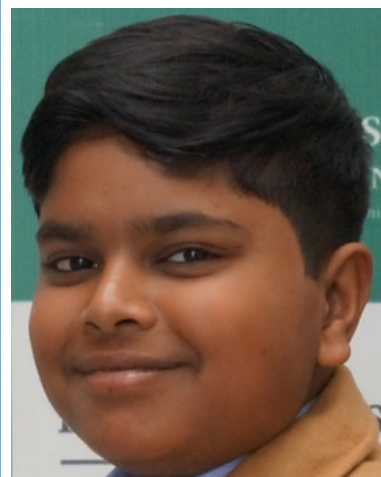
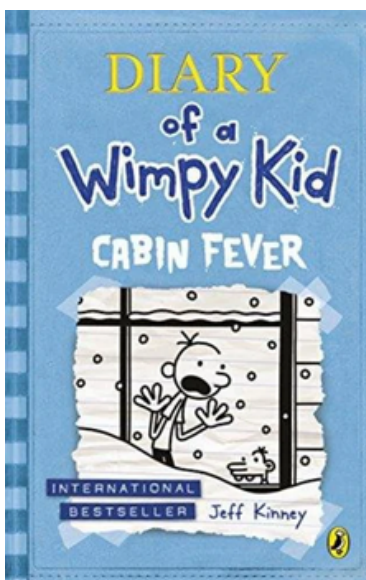


Library Review of the Month

They learned how neem helps in keeping our body clean from the inside and outside—just like nature’s own doctor!

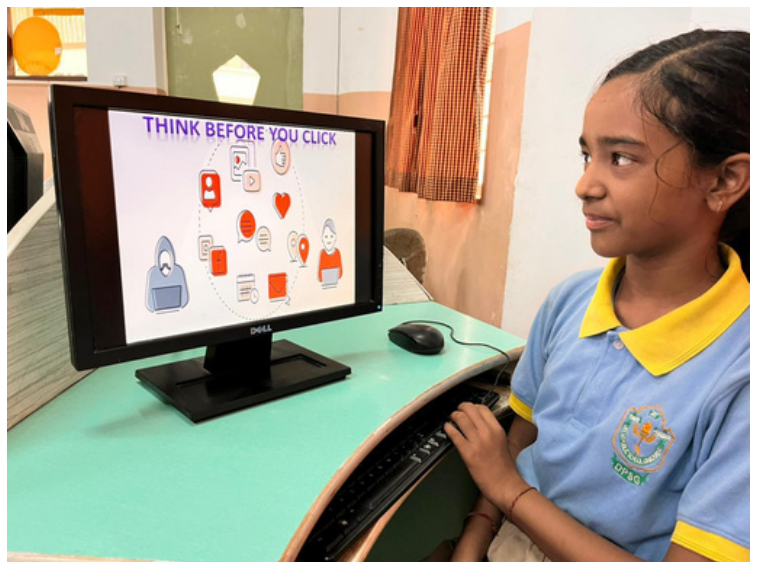
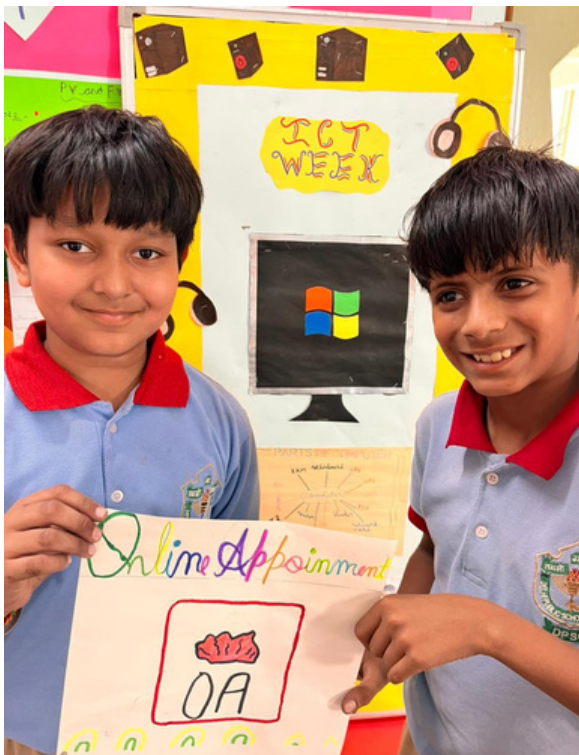


PYP ICT Week: Exploring the Digital World with Responsibility and Creativity
