



**ASSESSMENT POLICY AND PLAN
CLASSES VI TO X
SECONDARY WING DPSGMR**

- *In the backdrop of the guiding principles, our assessment approach comprises:*
 - A. ***Learner Engaged Assessment Practices [LEAP]*** : During and end of UI transaction (including throughout and at the end of the session plans)
 - B. ***Standardized Assessment Practices [SAP]***: Mid-term (Half Yearly Exam) & End -term (Annual Exam) Assessments
- There will be Unit of Inquiry Cycles, before Mid Term Examinations and after Mid Term and before Term End Examination.
- It is mandatory to give and pass the End Term Examination to get promotion to the next class.
- It is mandatory to secure 40% marks (in classes VI to IX) in cumulative of theory and practicals / assessment of notebooks, assignment & subject enrichment activities to gain promotion to the next class.
- If a child scores less than the minimum passing marks in two subjects in cumulative result she/he will have to appear for a re-exam.
- Students studying in classes VI - X need to have 75% attendance.
- All policies are subject to change as per the modifications and amendments in CBSE norms.
- If a student in classes IX and X is opting for a vocational subject as compulsory subject under National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) and fails in any one of the three elective subjects (i.e. Science, Mathematics and Social Science), then its marks will be replaced by the marks of Vocational subject and result of Class X Board Examinations will be computed accordingly.
- If a student in class IX and X is opting for an additional language as a sixth subject and fails in Language II then marks in the additional language will replace the marks of Language II.
- Scholarship in Class XI will be based on the result of five main subjects only.
- *Rules for Retest:*
 - If a child is representing the school, then only the retest paper will be conducted with due permission from the Principal.
 - Retest in Mid Term / End Term Examination will be conducted in case a student suffers from a serious ailment with the condition that the parents bring his/her medical certificate the same day and take permission from the Principal.

EXAM STRUCTURE

For Class X

There will be Unit of Inquiry Cycles, Mid Term Examination and Final External Examination.

The weightage to different tests/examination is

- a) Internal Assessment: 10% based on Periodic Assessment (to be sent by school to CBSE)
- b) Internal Assessment: 10% based on Portfolios and Subject Enrichment Activities (to be sent by school to CBSE)
- c) External Assessment: 80% (to be conducted by CBSE)
