TIMELINE ON ROLE MODELS: A JOURNEY THROUGH INSPIRATION

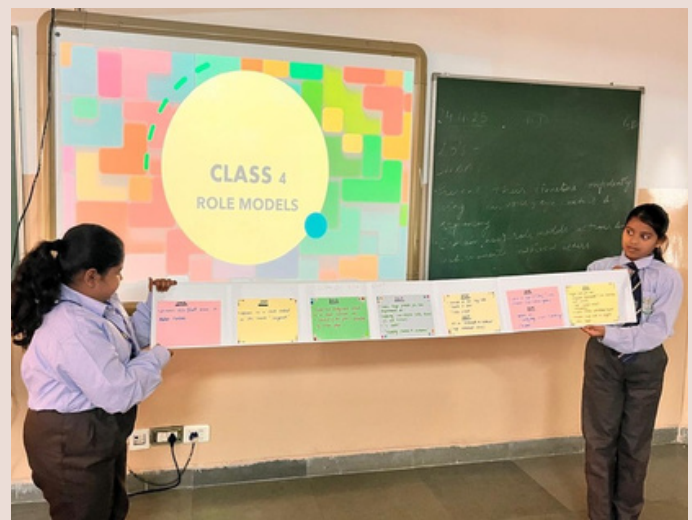
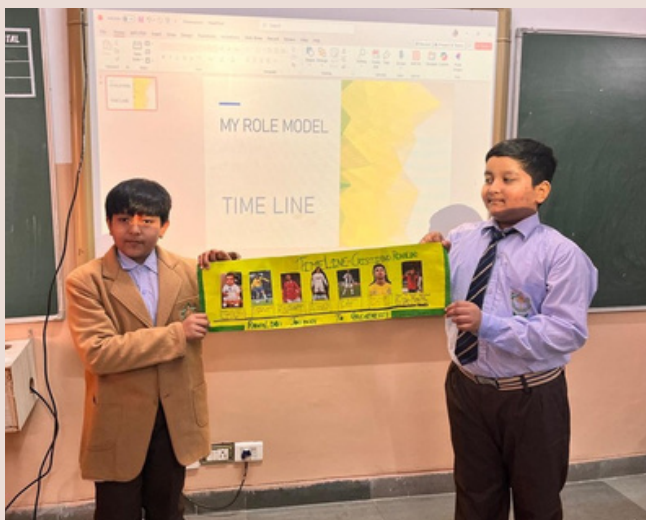
