The poem on significance of lohri was presented by shraddha Sharma of class XI

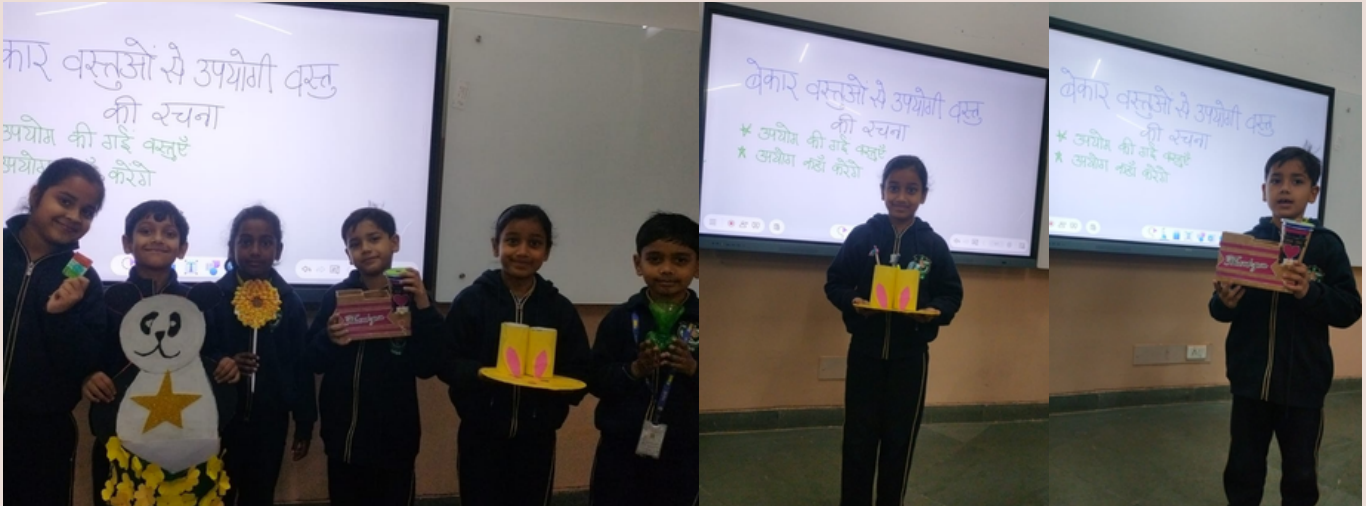
