STUDENT VISIT TO THE OBEROI HOTEL, NEW DELHI



Gurugram: The Commerce and Humanities students of Grade 12 undertook an educational visit to The Oberoi Hotel, New Delhi, on August 26th, organised by Team DPSG. The primary objective of the visit was to expose students to diverse career opportunities in the hospitality industry and to observe the practical application of concepts they study in Business Studies and related subjects.

Upon arrival, the students were warmly welcomed by the Human Resources team of The Oberoi. The session began with a detailed orientation on career prospects in hotel management by their training department head, covering areas such as food and beverage services, front office management, housekeeping, culinary arts, event management, and an intern Recruitment Process named STRP (Specialised Training and Recruitment Program).

Students observed the recruitment and selection process followed by the hotel's HR department. The managers explained how candidates are sourced, interviewed, and trained, ensuring alignment with the hotel's service excellence standards. They took a tour of various departments in the hotel, including sections for food and beverages, luxury rooms and their maintenance, various branded outlets, and specialty restaurants run by various Michelin-starred chefs.

The Oberoi graciously hosted a lunch for students and teachers in the staff canteen, offering first hand exposure to how the staff enjoys their meal in the hotel. The visit was highly interactive, with students engaging in a Q&A session, asking about internships, required qualifications, and the balance between theoretical knowledge and practical skills in hospitality careers.

NATIONAL SPACE DAY 2025



On August 23rd, 35 students of DPSG Palam Vihar attended the National Space Day 2025 celebrations at the Nehru Planetarium, New Delhi.
